Lorna Simpson's exhibition to the Serlachius Museums in Finland Summer 2023

US artist Lorna Simpson's exhibition *Haze* will be seen at the Serlachius Museums Summer 2023. Simpson is considered one of the most influential conceptual artists of this time. Her exhibition at Serlachius Museum Gösta is her premier in Finland.

Lorna Simpson, Haze 13 May-8 October 2023

Lorna Simpson (b. 1960) came to prominence in the 1980s through her pioneering approach to conceptual photography, which featured striking juxtapositions of text and staged images and raised questions about the nature of representation, identity, gender, race and history. The exhibition presents a cross-section of her multivalent oeuvre, focusing especially on her monumental ice paintings. The show has been implemented in cooperation with Kunstmuseum Thun and Hauser & Wirth. The exhibition is curated by Laura Kuurne, Head of Collections and Exhibitions of the Serlachius Museums.

Minna Henriksson & Ahmed Al-Nawas, Genesis 4 February-19 November 2023

The exhibition year starts with Minna Henriksson (b. 1976) and Ahmed Al-Nawas' (b. 1980) exhibition *Genesis*, which is strongly linked to the Serlachius family who prospered from paper industry and their activities in industry and politics as well as in the art world. The exhibition at the Gustaf Museum, former head office of the Serlachius company aims to offer an alternative depiction of the founding of the Serlachius company.

Elena Näsänen, Night and Day 25 March 2023-3 March 2024

Strong female artists' presence in Serlachius Museums will continue in 2023. Finnish artist Elena Näsänen's (b. 1968) video installation interlaces two scenes from different parts of Europe struggling with climate change. *Night and Day* focuses on the consequences of climate change: migration, global inequality and the resultant guilt. The installation *Night and Day* is an independent work, cut partly from the scenes of her short film *Turbulent Waters* completed in 2022.

Pirjetta Brander, Undercurrent 25 March-3 September 2023

For Finnish artist Pirjetta Brander (b. 1970), making art is exploring an undercurrent. She often depicts unpleasant truths from the boundaries of the senses and understanding. The basis of Brander's art is acquisition of knowledge. With her works, she maps the ways of existence in the world and ponders how it is possible to tolerate existence. The exhibition is curated by Laura Kuurne.

Anna Estarriola, 23 September 2023-3 March 2024

In autumn 2023, Anna Estarriola will implement in Art Museum Gösta an installation which has not been named yet. Estarriola is known for her uncannily enchanting sculptures and media installations. In her work, the artist combines sculpture, moving image, performance, sound and electronics to create affectively charged images, scenes and situations. Estarriola's work often explores encounters between human and non-human, the known and the unknown as well as animate and inanimate existence. The exhibition is curated by Petra Lehtoruusu.
